- HACC Life Without Barriers going well
- almost at red light for domestic assistance assessments
- more aware of people struggling with mobility around the house needing ramps and rails etc.
- MES (Metropolitan Equipment Scheme) do ramps for no cost; shower rails, magnetic door stoppers etc.
- have contractors with agreements with police clearances, please send through referrals for gardening services – contact Di at diane.lorimer@lwb.org.au

Frances – City of Mitcham

- looking for gaps and how we might future plan our services
- what will be the impact if we lose group 2 funding?
- increased Don Juan Groups putting on extra trips
- extra funding available to provide taxis for appointments

- maintenance and mods have been busy outputs very high loads of gardening because of recent fires
- trying to boost social programs
- no waiting list for anything at the moment

Janet – A2HC

- A2HC finishing on 30 June 2015
- A2HC are still the referral centre for ACAT, HACC and Domiciliary Care
- · short term planning going on
- still getting referrals in trying to prioritise
- will eventually start pushing ACATS to My Aged Care will continue to work on important referrals during this process

Prue - Life Care

- reforms will not change too much at Life Care
- client base growing
- · social outings every fortnight until the end of June
- Health and Wellbeing Seminar 10 weeks cooking demonstrations, nutrition, exercise, personal security and more – Reynella Village starting 10 February – Payneham starting 12 February
- ongoing groups Crafty Chat group, Young at Heart group
- vacancies in Social Support and Centre Based Day Care

Fiona – Metropolitan Referral Unit

- programs through MRU are still ongoing
- always services available
- reforms don't seem to be affecting MRU
- might get more referrals to keep people out of hospitals with the announced changes to hospitals & health care happening

Russell - ACH

all programs open - no waiting lists for most

- modified domestic service so no waiting list but giving less services in a shorter time frame – waiting for My Aged Care
- some changes in staff already no coordinator for domestic services
 work spread out amongst everyone else
- short term is open (criteria HACC eligible clients, coming out of hospital etc. - crisis only)
- doing lots of modifications and maintenance
- disability under 65 giving short term services until end of financial year
- have lots of key safes
- level 2 everywhere especially for those that have Centrelink assessments - level 2 packages are not being taken up
- relooking at gutter cleaning was on hold can restart now
