<p>Project Officer Report</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Training Survey: the top 8 topics that people want are Social Inclusion & Community Participation, Practicalities of Consumer Directed Care, Working with People with Dementia, Mental Health and the Older Person, Carers Health & Wellbeing, Consumer Choice & Consumer Voice, Restorative Care, Wellness & Reablement and Technology and Older People. • Discussion about type of social inclusion training - training we did with BPP 'Alone in the Crowd' was a couple of years ago – suggestion made that workers are put off when marketed as training - find another way to promote it to get more people interested in attending - make it exciting • Southern Adelaide Health Alliance, 100 Day Project: In February this year a Task Force Workshop was held and possible 100 day projects were identified. <p>Guest Speaker</p>	<p>Josephine Brown: Access to Home Care (A2HC)</p> <p>Josephine had been invited to the group to discuss possible strategies to increase referrals to social programs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Currently most referrals received are for domestic • Calls go through a triage process - diverted straight to ACAT or to intake officers - depends on needs of the client • Is there away A2HC could explore social needs? Often this is information that is obtained during subsequent conversations. • A2HC is funded until June 2015 • Carelink website – need to keep traffic lights up to date • A suggestion has been made to bring together organisations that are new to HACC funding – to meet them & find out what services they are offering...this could be a useful process • Discussion about the enabling model and how important that is • The use of light weight equipment so people can do things for themselves • The reforms are creating the change from consumer to customer - can dictate what they want • Josephine will speak with A2HC team leaders about issues that were discussed and will feed back to sally in an email – the group are keen to receive more referrals • SA Community Connect is also a good data base for social connections to use along with SIS - http://sacommunity.org/ • If more than one organisation can provide a service – referral is usually sent to both providers 	<p>Josephine to email Sally re outcome of discussion with Team Leaders</p>
