



SSRG Workgroup Terms of Reference Social Inclusion Workgroup

The Southern Services Reform group is a HACCC funded project based in the Southern Metropolitan region of Adelaide and includes the local government areas of Onkaparinga, Holdfast bay, Marion and Mitcham.

The Collaborative Projects are funded to develop and support a formal mechanism for facilitating service system reform and to improve service cooperation and coordination at a regional level. The project engages with services that affect the HACCC target group.

It is anticipated that collaboration between programs, services and sectors will lead to improved quality of life outcomes for the target group, including independence and increased participation in their communities.

The aim of the Social Inclusion Workgroup is to provide an opportunity for the sharing of information and strategies to work towards better outcomes for service users who are socially isolated. The group will be encouraged to explore innovative solutions that can be put in to practice. The recent workshops titled 'Cultivating People, Programs and Community' by Dr Mandy Stanley will be shared and discussed and can be used as a foundation to the work planned by the group.

Roles and Responsibilities

- Focus on project work in a pre-determined time frame.
- Participate in information sharing and promote the aims and outcomes of the project.
- In consultation with Project Officer, establish a project proposal to guide performance.
- Meet monthly.
- Support the Steering Committee to meet its roles and responsibilities – at least one member from the Steering Committee will participate in the Workgroup.
- Participate in forums and consultations as necessary.
- Elect a chairperson for the Workgroup and review bi-annually.
