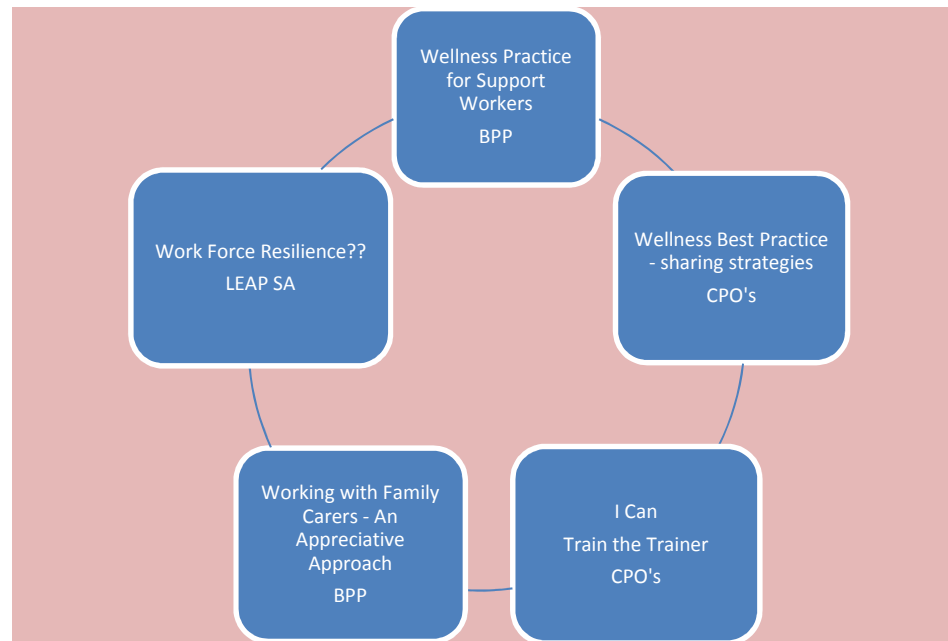

Annual Activity Plan /Report

- Sally has received an 'Approval of Annual Progress Report' letter from the Department of Health. The SSRG Grant Agreement Manager will be Liz Edwards.
- The Annual Activity Plan was submitted to the Department of Health in December 2015 and has been accepted by the Department. They were satisfied with the content and verbally commented that it could be used as a best practice guide.

State-wide Collaborative Projects

- The CPO's are organising a State-wide Symposium to celebrate 12 months of CHSP. It will be held at the South Adelaide Football Club at Noarlunga and aims to focus on best practice and wellness.
- The CPO's will be offering a suit of wellness training sessions in 2016, these will include:



- The Collaborative Projects would like the Wellness Practice and Working with Family Carers workshops to be delivered State-wide in the first half of the year.
- The Wellness Best Practice will be rolled out after the July Symposium. It will be an interactive workshop written by Sally and Judith Gooden (Hills Collaborative Project).
- The I Can training will be launched at the July Symposium. Prior to this all CPO's will be trained, mentored and able to deliver sessions. A wider train-the-trainer process will be developed to roll out to the sector in the second half of 2016.
- The Collaborative Projects are going to engage a consultant to evaluate the Collaborative Projects outlining the Project's past and potential future.
- There are CPO vacancies in two of the Metro regions – Eastern and Western Collaborative Projects auspiced by Domiciliary care. Gary Sawyer has just left the Murray-Mallee Project and has been replace by Julie Wilhelmn.

War Against Loneliness - update

- Umbrella postcards are currently being printed and will be distributed to the region very soon. The purpose of the cards is to lengthen the life of the War against loneliness project, extending the awareness campaign around social isolation/loneliness. The War against loneliness web-page has been updated and the calendar can be downloaded from this site. Encouraging older people to link into community and appropriate services is one of the desired outcomes.

Southern Region Network Meeting

- Collated results from the workshop 'CHSP - What's going well and what's not?' show that there are still a number of issues affecting the reform process but there appears to be a willingness to identify and implement possible solutions.
- It is proposed that a project group is established from those involved in the initial workshop to further develop some of the possible solutions identified.
- The information will be collated with the outcomes from a similar workshop delivered by the Eastern collaborative Project, and then with other Collaborative Project results to develop a State-wide perspective. This information will be passed on to the Department.

<p>Information sharing</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sue (ECH) – preparing for the aged care package reforms in 2017 • Coral (AASA) – Link workers and community service team are now together in the one team. The programs cover the whole of the state, providing individual and group services. Working closely with the RAS. • Lynda (City of Mitcham) – has been in the Acting Manager role for 1.5 weeks and is working on fees policy and guidelines. Planning for 2018 and beyond including future priorities. • Katrina (Carers SA) – Getting ready for the new reporting database – Data Exchange. • Gill (Resthaven) – Also preparing for the Data Exchange and working through problems. • Lui (City of Onkaparinga) – Students from Flinders Medical Centre studying dietetics/nutrition will work with the Active Ageing Team on placement for 6 weeks. They will spend some of their time at the Positive Ageing Centres. Lui also attended the introductory ‘Changing Lives through Music’ session at the Arts Centre. The region is invited to send anyone interested to the workshops which are being delivered in February/March. • Mandy (Carer Support) – DCSI funding for a video - cultural awareness session about Aboriginals in the caring role, the video is for workers in the industry. It is not focused at remote Aboriginals. The video will be offered to 17 organisations and the project will be finished in June. Once this is complete, the public can view the video on the internet. • Sally – CPN and SSRG will partner in a project about dementia and driving.
